THE THREEPENNY OPERA by Bertolt Brecht

The Threepenny Opera was adapted from John Gay's eighteenth century 'Beggar's Opera' by Brecht and Elisabeth Hauptmann, with music by Kurt Weill. It was first staged in 1928 in Berlin and was seen as a satire on the bourgeois society of the Weimar Republic. Since then it has been continuously performed by both amateur and professional companies, and our own production will take the form of a 1920's Berlin cabaret.

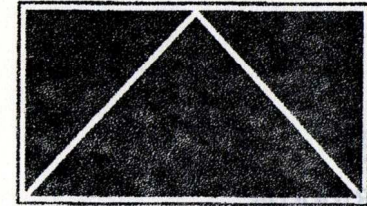

The seeds of 'The House of Bernarda Alba' comes from Lorca's childhood; a domineering widow, Frasquita Alba Sierra, who lived opposite the Garcia Lorcas and kept her daughters away from village life; Jose Benavides, known popularly as Pepico el de Roma, who married the eldest daughter and, when she died, sought the hand of her more beautiful younger sister; his cousin, Clotilde, who was not allowed to wear her favourite green dress in a time of mourning and could flaunt it only among the hens in the back yard.

From these fragments Lorca created the claustrophobic house where Bernarda Alba reigns supreme, imposing the most traditional values concerning the role of women, inheritance and the nature of honour on her household and creating friction and frustration among her five daughters, until finally her youngest daughter tries to assert her right to live.
