With regular income only from the eldest sister, Kate, the five Mundy girls provide a home for seven-year-old Michael, son of the youngest sister, and for their brother, Father Jack, a missionary priest who has just been repatriated from Africa by his superiors after twenty-five years there.

During the happenings on two days of that summer, we become aware of personal and external influences, both Christian and pagan in a poignant domestic situation brought to life with fluent humour.
