NOTES ON THE PLAY

Our author has used the ancient legend of Helen of Troy as a background for his play. Helen, the wife of Menelaus, king of Sparta, has eloped with Paris and been brought to the Trojan court. The Greeks demand retribution and the Trojan War ensues Giraudoux shows us the moment when war might have been averted. He reveals the forces of war, poetic, political, scientific and banal determined to fight. Hector, a disillusioned warrior supported by his mother, Hecuba and his wife Andromache strives to prevent the Trojan fall. How these efforts are frustrated is the core of the play.

Troy fell, her sons were slain, her daughters were carried off

to captivity and the legend completed.

In these days the play is as urgent and relentless as in these ancient times. G.W.W.
