

The play which you see to-night, is an adaptation by Peter Barnes of two plays by Wedekind, "Earth Spirit" and "Pandora's Box", written between 1892 and 1901. The plays became notorious due to repression by the Censors, both German and English, and due to controversy over the opera, by Alban Berg, which was not produced in full until 1979.

It is notable as an expression, from a sexual standpoint, of the rise of Woman, a movement given a different emphasis by G.B. Shaw and Emmeline Pankhurst in England.

The tragedies and disasters of the play arise basically from the inability of the Victorian male to accept that a woman's freedom (in morals and attitude to the sexual impulse) should be the same as that of her lord and master.
