History places Lenin, James Joyce and the Dada poet, Tristan Tzara, in the same place, Zurich, at the same time, the spring of 1918. But the imagination of the playwright turns these prosaic facts into a wild and witty plot which has its hero, not one of those revolutionary political or literary men, but an obscure British consulate official (also real) whose only claim to fame is as an obscure footnote in 'Ulysses'.

TRAVESTIES revolves around this man's sometimes dodgy memories, which include a production of 'The Importance of being Earnest' which has haunted him all his life . . . many pairs of ruined trousers . . . the Lenins returning to their revolution in a sealed train . . . and the wooing of his first true love.
