Faith Healer by Brian Friel

This play was written in 1979 and was premièred in America. It provides more evidence of Friel's stature as one of the most significant playwrights of the second half of the twentieth century. In it Friel continues the Celtic tradition of story telling. Three characters engage the audience with their differing memories of the most crucial events and situations in their lives together. They reveal the beliefs that they hold, the illusions which sustain them, the feelings which they have for one another. They present us with three versions of the truth; or what appears to be the truth. Each character tells us his or her account of reality and in doing so everything we have seen and heard is open to question. So we the audience become involved in three individual notions of the truth. The play suggests that communication between individuals is not always easy and our individual version of the truth may differ.

The three characters tell their stories through very different kinds of language but language between human beings is not only verbal. Maybe we communicate through the magic of the laying on of hands; or perhaps we can invoke situations and responses through the ritual use of incantations spells and popular music.

Whatever response we have to this play it is evident that Friel is a major playwright His major works such as "Translations" and "Dancing at Lughnasa" will be studied and performed for many years to come and Friel's name will be added to that of J.M.Synge, W.B.Yeats and Sean O'Casey as a great Irish writer.
